Will of Frances Newman

I Frances Newman of Piddletrenthide in the county of Dorset widow being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say

I give unto my daughter Frances Charlotte Cox my mourning ring

I give unto my servant Ann Davis all my wearing apparel

I give unto Mary Chipp daughter of Thomas and Mary Chipp the sum of £10

I give devise and bequeath unto Thomas Tomkins of Piddletrenthide aforesaid gentleman all my real estate and also all the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate goods chattels rights credits and effects whatsoever and wheresoever

To hold to him his heirs and assigns for ever to and for his and their own proper use and benefit

And I hereby appoint the said Thomas Tomkins sole executor of this my will

And I hereby revoke all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1823
