Dorset Esquire being thankes to my Glorieus GOD at this time in good
health and of sound memory doe make this my last Will and Testament
in manner following First I doe most humbly and thickefully render and
bequeath my precious and immortall soul into the hands of my gracieus
Redeemer and Saviour Jesus Christ fervently and faithfully imploring him to
guide me by his gracie here whilst I live in this valley of tears and when I
dye to receiv me into everlasting Glory with Higly GOD and his blessed
Angells for evermore Item Whereas I stand stured in see simple of land in the
Reverence appertaining after the death of the Lady Nevill of and in Thornbury Park
and severall lands and hermis therewithall enjoyed ortoale in the parish of
Thornbury in the County of Gloucester wherch I lately purchased of John Cary
and Giles Dule Esquires I doe give and devise the said park hermis and
lands unto William Tongwood my sonne in Law Harr and Peter
Walter my servant and the survivors of them and the executors and Administrators
of such survivors for and during the time and termes of five hundred pounds
to remane imediately after my death But in Trust and confidure That they
shall after the death of the said Lady Nevill by lease or leases sale or
otherwise out of the issues and profits of the premises or any part thereof unto
and pay the sume of Thre thousand pounds unto my Grandchild Anne
Vicarow when she shal attain the age of one and twenty yeare or day of
marriag which shall first happen And also raise and pay the further
sume of three thousand pounds unto Barbara Newman Sister of the said
Anne when she the said Barbara shall attaine her age of one and twenty
yeare or day of her mariage which shall first happen And in case either
of them shall happen to dye before their said respective ages or dayes of
marriage Then my will is That the survivors of them shall have there
thousand pounds out of the premises 2 p^s 7 s^d 2 d^c 3 p^s hereby denys
in trust as aforesaid and noe more And this I doe not only out of the
natural affection I bear unto my said Grandchildren but in discharege of
a Note under my hand and seale to that or some such purpose given by me
unto my daughter in Law M^r Grace Newman their Mother And my
further will is That in case the said Anne or Barbara shall marry without
the consent and approbation of Henry Edmunds Esquire their Grandfather
the said Grace Newman their Mother and Richard Newman their Brother
the survivors or survivors of them That then the said Anne or Barbara
soe marrying without such consent as aforesaid shall respettificate but
five hundred pounds out of the trust of the said premises and noe more
provided alwayes and the true intent and meaning of this my will is that
in case my said Grandchild Richard Newman (whom I pray GOD to
preserv) shall happen to dye without issue of his body whereby severall
lands tenements and hereditaments in Preston in the County of Northampton

will descend and come unto the said Anne and Barbara as Co-heiress unto the
 said Richard their Brother which Lands and Tenments by computation will
 be better worth then six thousand pounds or in case the said Anne and
 Barbara or either of them shall demand and present at law my Executors
 heiremaster named for any sume of money given to them or either of them by
 their fatheres last Will, wherof I am sole Executor and have provid the same
 or for any money given to them or either of them by the Will of my deare
 wife not proved which sume and sumes of money are unconsiderable and
 not wise equall to this my bequest to them respectively made or if my said
 Executor shall out of my personall Estate or otherwise raise and pay the said
 severall sumes of money hereby bequeathed unto them the said Anne and
 Barbara in manner aforesaid Then my said devise for the said sume of five
 hundred pounds and the said Trust for raisynge the said severall sumes of
 three thousand pounds aperte and all other the sume and sumes of money
 before mentioned to and for the said Anne and Barbara shall be absolutely
 void and of none effect Any thing herein contained to the contrary therof in
 any wise notwithstanding Item wheras my said sonne in Law S^t William
 Longwood by one or more of his Obligations stands indebted unto me in the
 principall sume of five hundred pounds the Interest whereof he the said
 S^t William by my consent hath paid and agreed to be payed unto my deare
 daughter Anna Christiane his wife during her life without any Account
 from her for the same I do hereby give the said five hundred pounds after
 the death of the said Anna Christiane their Mother unto my Grandchildren
 Anne Thomasine Elizabeth Mary and Edward Longwood equally to be re-
 divided amongst them And if any of them shall dye before marriage I will
 that his or her part so dyng shall be equally payed to and amongst the
 survivors or surviour of them Item I give and bequeath unto the said
 S^t William Longwood and Peter Walter and to their heires Administrato-
 r and Executrix for and during the remainder of my tyme therin All that my
 four Mesuages or Tenements with their appurtenances situate in Custonshill
 in the Parish of S^t Margarets Regis in the severall occupations of my selfe
 Francis Hollis Newman my sonne Edward Scott my sonne in Law and
 herde of one M^r Cook But nevertheless upon the severall Trusts and
 confidents following and for no other end whatsoeuer (That is to say) In trust
 to permit and suffer the said Edward Scott and my deare daughter Frances
 his wife to live in and inhabit the said Mesuage wherein they now dwelle
 for so many yeres of the said tyme as she the said Frances shall happen
 to live without paying any rent for the same And upon further trust to
 lease or sell the said other three Mesuages and the said Mesuage in the
 possession of the said Edward Scott after the death of his said Frances his
 wife at and for the utmost value and the monys which shall or may arise
 by such leases or sale to pay and apply the same to the separate use and
 benefit of the said Frances my daughter and her children by the said Edward
 Scott in such manner and by such proportion as she the said Frances shall
 by writing under her hand and seal to be attested by two or more credible
 witnesses first and appoint And for want of such attested writing to make
 for all and every the daughter and daughters of the said Frances by the said
 Edward in equall share and degree each with the other provided always
 and it is my will and meaning that the said four Mesuages shall stand and
 be charged with the yearly rent of ten pounds during the remainder of the
 said trust to be paid by equall half yearly payments to the person or
 persons to whom the inheritance of the said house shall appertaine in part of

a greater Rent payable by me self for the said premises amongst other things
And that my said Executor shall have the trust and possession of the said
Messuage now in my possession for the space of six months from the time of my
death without paying or being accountable for any Rent for the same Item I
give and bequeath unto my said Daughter in Law M^r Grace Newman the
house wherin she now dwells situate in Tufton street aforesaid for soe
many years of my termes in the same as she shall continue in her present
Widowhood And from and after her death or marriage I give the said
Messuage unto the said Barbara her daughter for and during all the
remainder of the said term which shall be then to come and unexpired
But it is nevertheless in my will and meaning That they the said Grace
Newman and Barbara Newman as they shall respectively be in the
possession of the said Messuage set bequeathed to them shall pay yearly
unto my Executors during the said term the summe of forty shillings in
further part of the said greater Rent Itm I give and bequeath unto my
Granddaughters Fraunces, Katherine and Grace Scott the summe of two hundred
pounds apiece to be paid unto them at their respective ages of eighteen years
or dayes of marriage which of them shall first happen And in case either of
them shall dye before such age or marriage the share of her see dying
shall be paid to the survivor by equal proportiones And my will is that
my said daughter Scott shall receive to her own use and with her own

until they the said Fraunces Katherine and Grace shall attaine their
respective ages of eighteen years or be married for their better maintenance
and education which said six hundred pounds I doe see give as aforesaid
in discharge of the like summe given unto them the said Fraunces Katherine

I give and bequeath unto all and every the sonnes and daumes of my said
daughter Scott wherch she now hath or may have by the said Edward
Scott and wheth shall be living at the time of my death the summe of one
hundred pounds apiece to be paid unto them respectively at such times and
by such proportiones as my said Executor shall think meet for their
education and maintenance And it is my will And I doe hereby direct That
the Interest thereof in the mean time be paid to the hands of their Mother
the better to enable her to keepe and breed them up Item I give unto my
Grandson John Evelyn the summe of twenty pounds, and to my
and Richard Evelyn his Brothers the summe of one hundred pounds
apiece to be paid to them at their severall ages and if they attaine their
severall ages of one and twenty years And if they the said William and
Richard Evelyn or either of them shall dye before their said age the
part of him soe dying to you to the survivor And if both of them shall
happen to dye before their said ages then I devise the said two hundred
pounds to the children of my said daughter Scott by the said Edward Scott
to be divided and paid to them by equal sharps Item I give and devise
unto my deare Sister M^r Jane Cope one Annuity or yearly payment of
Twenty six pounds of lawfull money of England freed and discharged of
and from all manner of Captis and reprises whatsoever for and during the
term of her naturall life to comence from the day of my death and to be
paid at the rate of forty shillings by the month according to the Lunari
months wherch said Annuity I doe devise to her as aforesaid in full
discharge of all Agreements by me heretofore made with my said Sister
touching her maintenance and not otherwise And it is my will that she

I should live in the ffarme house of ffischedead aforesaid and have from th^e
 said ffarme sufficient ffuell for firing without paying any thing for the same. Item I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Elizabeth Warre the sume of two hundred pounds to be paid unto her at the end of six moneths from and after my death if sicke the saide Elizabeth shall be then living. Item I give and bequeath unto the said Peter Waller the sume of ffifty pounds — pounds and unto my Neice Diana Waller wife of the said Peter the sume of Ten pounds And unto all my children and Grandchildren and their husbands and wifes respectively Twenty shillings aperte for rings having already liberally provided for them. Item I give and devise unto Anne White daughter of my sister Anne White deceased one shilling or yearly payment of ffive pounds for and during the time of her naturall life to be paid to her by quarterly payments the first payment to commence from the first quarter day next after my decease if she the said Anne lives unmarried And this I devise in discharge of the interest of ffifty pounds given by the last will of my deare deene Richard Newman to the poore of ffischedead aforesaid with an intimation therin that the profits therof should be applied in the first place to such of his kindred in the said parish as should happen to be in need or wrode to that effect. Item I give unto my servant Mary Perkins if she lives with me at the time of my death ffive pounds to my servant Ann Whyle if she lives with me at my death ffifty shillings. And to my servant John Syrer if he lives with me at my death Twenty shillings over and above the wages whiche to them at that time shall be respectively due and owing. Item I give unto my ancient friend Dr Henry Kirkhead Twenty shillings to buy him a ring. Item I give unto the poore of the parish of ffischedead aforesaid and to the poore of the parish of Weston in the said County of Dorsett the sume of ffive pounds aperte to be distributed by the Overseers of the poore of the said respective parishes. And the better to enable my said Grandsonne Richard Newman to pay all my debts and legacies and to discharge the said Shembury Park Lands and tenements of and from the several and respective sumes of money therupon charged as aforesaid I doe hereby constitute and appoint the said Peter Waller Executor of this my last Will and Testament in trust and for the only benefit of my said Grandsonne Richard Newman until he the said Richard Newman shal attaine his age of one and twenty years and not otherwise or for any longer time. And when he shall attaine his said age of one and twenty years then it is my will that in my said Grandsonne shall take upon him the said trust and execution of this my will And I doe hereby from thence forward ordain constitute and appoint him the said Richard Newman my Grandsonne sole Executor of this my will beseeching GOD Almighty to give him grace to walk worthy of him and to perform his bisches will and then I am sure he will truly perform mine. Lastly I desire to be buried and placed neynt the Corps of my said deare wife in the new Vault which I have lately made with an Isle from the Chappell of the Parish Church of ffischedead aforesaid decently without ostentation desiring and imploring GOD Almighty's grace in thi matuscule That his Year of GOD may ever rule me in all my thoughts words and actions That I may doe justly love mercy and walk humbly before my GOD all the dayes of my life and so assuredly shall live with him forever in Glory in hopes whereof I doe rejoice exceedingly In witness whereof I have to every sheet of this my will containing in number seaven set my hand and to the last sheete only my seal this Thirteenth

day of January anno Domini One thousand six hundred and ninety five

Signed sealed published and declared to be the last will and testament of
the said Richard Newman containing as aforesaid two sheets of paper

Wheras upon my agreement in writing with my Grandson
Mr Thomas Ward concerning the payment of Two thousand and
fifty hundred pounds and the interest thereof, the remainder of his Master's
marriage portion with other monies therein mentioned my said Grandson
is left at liberty to take such monies and compound as he may or can upon
and against the Rectory of Queen Canutes in the County of Somersett for
destroying the interest of Three hundred pounds which Thomas Ward his
Grandson did owe him before he came upon a Mortgagor of part
of the said Rectory now in regard Peter Walter one of the persons named
in my will as one of my executors is well acquainted with all my
transactions relating to the premises and with all proceedings had
thereupon I do hereby referre the remainder thereof unto him and do
direct that he shall by and out of my personal estate pay unto my
said Grandson the interest money of the said Two hundred pounds
if he shall receive me to be engaged either in law or equity to make
payment of the same And whereas by my said will I have constituted
and appointed the said Peter Walter executor of the same in trust for
my Grandson Richard Newman until he the said Richard Newman
shall attain his age of one and twenty years and no longer And that
from thenceforth the said Richard Newman shal take upon himself
the administration and execution thereof Now it is my will further do hereby
direct that the said Executorship of him the said Peter Walter shall
not determine and terminate when he the said Richard Newman
shall attain his age of one and twenty years But that he the said Mr.
Peter Walter shall from hence to hence forth continue and be a
joint and co-executor with him the said Richard Newman but nevertheless
in trust and for the sole benefit of him the said Richard Newman and such
otherwise I give unto my sister M^r Jane Cop over and besides the
yearly payment of Twenty six pounds devised unto her by my said
will the sume of Thirteen pounds by the year for and during the
time of her naturall life to be paid unto her at the rate of Twenty
shillings by the month according to the lunatic months I give unto the
said Peter Walter over and besides the Legacy to him given by my
said will the sume of Ten pounds I give unto my Servant Mary Criddle
if she be living in my service at the time of my death the sume of Three
pounds And unto my Servant Mary Perkins the sume of Six pounds
over and besides the money given to her by my will And I do hereby
desire and direct That the severall legacies and devicnes herein given
and made shall be taken deemeed and accounted a part of my will and
that the present containing one sheet of paper and part of another
be a Codicill of my said will In testimony of which I have to the first of
the said sheets setting my hand and to the last of them my hand and seale
this fifteene day of April in the year of our LORD One thousand six
hundred and ninety five Ri Newman signed sealed and published to be a
Codicill of the last will of the said Richard Newman in the presence of us
W^m Cotes Jacob Ward Mary Perkins.

 Richard Newman Esquire and greeting. Having desirous of making a
 further provision for my dear daughter, the neareste of M^r Edward Scott
 more than what I have already bequeathed unto her by my last will and
 Testament alredy made in writing I doe hereby give and bequeath unto my
 Grandsonne John Chapman in Trust for my said daughter All and every my
 bedds pewter brass hangings and other household goods which I now have
 in my house in Caxton street in the City of Westmⁿ. Except the several peculiars
 heremaster mentioned whiche is my desire shalld goe unto and be enjoyed by
 my Grandsonne Richard Newman That is to say All my Books, and other
 the furniture of my Closet lately taken out of the Hall, and my two bedds
 called the best bedds with all the furniture and appurtenances to them
 belonging together with six pair of the best Sheets and all my plate of
 what kind soever and twelve of each of my pictures as he the said Richard
 Newman shall make choice of, together with two of my best Trunks or Chests
 And its my will, that the said household goods see hereby given and
 bequeathed as aforesaid In trust for my said daughter, shall from time to
 time continue and be solely in her my said daughter exclusive of any demand
 right or interest of her said husband. And that it shall and may be lawfull
 for her my said daughter without the apprehension or consent of her said
 husband to give dispossess and direct the same household goods to such of her
 child or children as she shall think fit. And I doe hereby also give to my
 said daughter all my weareing apparel. And whereas I have hitherto
 subscrivd to the Stock of the Governour and Company of the Bank of
 England the summe of one thousand pounds, of which I have paid the summe
 of six hundred pounds, I doe hereby give and devise in Trust for my said
 Grandsonne Richard Newman the said summe of money soe subscrivd and
 the said six hundred pounds see paid as aforesaid in pursuance of such
 subscription unto Peter Walter one of the Executors of my said Will his
 heires and Assignes for ever by him to be sold if he shall see cause for the
 benefit and advantage of him the said Richard Newman I give to my said
 Grandsonne John Chapman the summe of five pounds to buy him incuring
 at my funerall. And I doe earnestly intreat and instruct my said Grandsonne
 Richard Newman in memory of me his most affectionate Grandfather who
 hath bee largely provided for him not only to take care of but also to my
 said daughters children by the said Edward Scott her husband in their
 respective durations and preferments Item I give unto my Cosin Joseph
 New and to his two sisters M^r Hannah Aldeworth and M^r Marlow the
 summe of five pounds apiece And lastly I doe heartily direct and desire that
 these presents may be taken and esteemed a part of my said Will and for a
 Codicill of the same. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

I George Olway of the parish of Woking in the County of Surrey a Peoman being ripe in body but of sound minde (praised be GOD) doe make and ordaine my last Will and Testament in manner following: That is to say my soul I commit to GOD who gave it me hopeing to be saved by the death of Jesus Christ my Redeemer And I commit my body to the earth to be decently buried by my Executor And as to my worldly Estate I purpos my will is That if it shall happen that my wife Johane be instant or with child at the time of my decease Then I give and devise all and singular my Lands Tenements and hereditaments whatsoever both freehold and freehold unto such child as shall be born of her for ever But if such child that shall happen to be born of my said wife as aforesaid shall dye before the attainment of the age of one and twenty years without issue And in case my said wife be not with child at the time of my decease see that I have not given by her Then I give and devise and appoint all and singular my said Lands Tenements and hereditaments as followeth: That is to say I give will and devise all my Lands and Tenements lying in Sunsfold in the County of Surrey and now in the occupation of Thomas Cumber or his Assignes and also all those my Lands and Tenements in the parish of Midhurst and Woolavington in the County of Sussex called Hawkes Land now in the occupation of John Cuff or his Assignes unto my loving Mother Jane Olway void for the term of her natural life And from and after the decease of my said Mother I will and devise the said Lands and Tenements in Sunsfold aforesaid unto my Brother Jacob Olway and to his heirs and Assignes for ever And I give and devise my said Lands and Tenements in Midhurst and Woolavington after my said Mothers decease unto my Brother Jacob Olway and to his heirs and Assignes for ever Item I give will and devise my Lands and Tenements in Leyshet in the said County of Sussex in the occupation of Andrew Tipp or his Assignes unto my said Brother Jacob Olway and to his heirs Exce^{ss} Adiu^{nt} and Assignes for ever from and after the decease of my said Mother on whom I have settled the same for her life Item I give and devise unto my said Brother Jacob Olway and to his heirs and Assignes for ever after the decease of my said wife Johane All the rest Lands and Tenements that I have settled upon my said wife for her jointure yet nevertheless it is my will and I do give and devise out of the said Lands and Tenements in jointure as aforesaid the summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull English money to be paid unto my said Brother Jacob Olway his Excess and dñe^{nt} in his and thre moneths within twelve moneths after the said Lands and Tenements in jointure as aforesaid shall come to the
